Nancy and Ricardo have been married for 17 years, 9 of those years living in the community of Las Cañadas. Both share openly their marriage has gone through very difficult times. Undoubtable the most challenging time in their life together was when Ricardo was unjustly imprisoned for being involved in an vehicle accident while working in which a person died.

"The most honest conversation I've ever had with God was locked up, alone in that prison cell" shared Ricardo.

Nancy **joined the foundation in Generation 2019** through an invitation from her sister-in-law Mily, a GEN14 graduate.

Ricardo joined the men's group in 2019, invited by Nancy, who enthusiastically shared that he should know about the program that the foundation offers to the families of the community.

"I was a little *fearful and skeptical* when I attended without a clear idea of why I should participate in the program." says Ricardo. "When I went to the introductory sessions I still couldn't find a strong enough reason to participate in the program. To be honest, the main motivation at the beginning was my wife's enthusiasm for me to be part of the foundation. It wasn't until the *first block* that I *found my purpose of staying* in the personal growth program.

I found out this wasn't about my wife or my kids, but about myself."

Nancy shares her motivation for continuing to participate at FEP. "During the process I have *learned skills* that I did not know I could develop, the *most important to communicate better* with the people around me. I can socialize and interact with other people without frustration because they think and act differently from me. I have learned to have a *better relationship with my family*, and to organize my time better at home"

For Ricardo "My group at the foundation gives me the opportunity to *de-stress by sharing my burdens* with them, and also getting different points of view on the same topic. The environment that exists at the Foundation holds the *hope* that we can create a

better world for our children."

Sons Thaddeus and Alfredo share "I like the foundation because I can learn, play and **be myself**. I like the English classes and the games we do in the sessions with the psychologist. I have learned about **respect and my emotions**. It gives us the opportunity to live and share with other children, and at the same time **learn in a fun way.**"

The family *hopes to graduate* from the process, remain connected with the foundation, and that their children have the *opportunit*y to continue learning in a healthy environment while challenging them to *improve in all aspects* of their lives in a gentle way. They want to continue contributing to their community within their possibilities and abilities to create a better environment.







For Ricardo he *hopes to be more tolerant* with his children and have a more loving and honest relationship with them.

Ricardo and Nancy are a couple who contribute a lot in their respective groups. They are a very responsible family with a high level of commitment, always striving to improve. They are *persistent in their individual and family growth*, and are an example of discipline for other members. They strive to apply what they learn in their own lives, and in their collective family lives.

Ricardo and Nancy lead a Christian congregation in a small community where Ricardo is the preacher, and Nancy leads the women's group. Both comment that the process they live at **FEP has helped them empathize** with the people who attend their church, and that through FEP sessions they learn tools that allow them to be better leaders.

"We must understand the human part of our congregation to be able to prepare them for their spiritual growth."

"Getting to the Foundation is like being somewhere out of Las Cañadas. Everything is clean, tidy and all the **people are transformed** into someone **friendly and generous**. Its Magical!"
